# **Presentation on Low Impact Development**

Low Impact Development (LID) is an innovative stormwater management approach with a basic principle that is modeled after nature: manage rainfall at the source using ways that work with nature. Dodd will share examples of how communities have used these strategies to protect their natural surroundings and enhance community livability.

Dodd Galbreath leads the Institute for Sustainable Practice of Lipscomb University in Nashville. The Institute is Tennessee's first academic sustainability program to develop future leaders for sustainability. Dodd led efforts to implement a nationally recognized wetlands conservation plan and to pass five legislative proposals for sustainable use of Tennessee's water supplies and native rivers. More recently Dodd has promoted natural/green infrastructure concepts for storm water management in Tennessee and provided sustainability consulting services for clients of URS Corporation, the nation's largest engineering design firm.
